MANDATORY WORKERS PAY REPORTING

Unite and the TUC call on the government to bring in mandatory disability pay gap reporting for all employers with more than 50 employees. The legislation should be accompanied by a duty on employers to produce targeted action plans identifying the steps they will take to address any gaps identified, including ensuring disabled workers with invisible impairments feel confident in completing workplace equality monitoring.

Unite will work with employers to review disability monitoring policies and practices to ensure any barriers to disabled workers confidently sharing information in equality monitoring exercises are identified and removed.
